The SRB

The Single Resolution Board (SRB) is the central resolution authority within the Banking Union (BU). Its mission is to ensure an orderly resolution of failing banks with minimum impact on the real economy and on public finances of the participating Member States and beyond. Therefore, the SRB is granted with specific tasks and responsibilities to prepare for, and carry out, the resolution of banks that are failing or likely to fail. The SRB is also responsible for managing the Single Resolution Fund, as established by the SRM Regulation, to ensure that medium-term funding support is available while a bank is being restructured and/or resolved.

Together with the National Resolution Authorities (NRAs) of participating Member States (MS), it forms the Single Resolution Mechanism (SRM). The SRB works closely with the NRAs, the European Commission (EC), the European Central Bank (ECB), the European Banking Authority (EBA) and National Competent Authorities (NCAs). It contributes to safeguarding financial stability.

The SRB is a self-financed agency of the European Union.

The SRB is an inclusive employer and we strive to reflect the diversity of the population we serve. We encourage you to apply irrespective of age, disability, ethnicity, gender, gender identity, race, religious beliefs, sexual orientation or other characteristics.





The job

The SRB is organising a call for expressions of interest with a view to establishing a reserve list of Temporary Agents for the position of Data Science Expert.

1. Profile

You will be part of the Financial Stability and Economic Analysis Unit, which is attached to Directorate A – Resolution Policy and Cooperation. The Unit has about 15 staff members providing horizontal support to resolution units related to topics of the Public Interest Assessment (PIA) which is the assessment determining whether a failing bank will be subject to resolution or can be subject to normal insolvency proceedings. The unit serves as the point of contact for data reporting issues and for data-driven analysis for resolution planning. It aims at ensuring a common understanding within the Single Resolution Mechanism of these horizontal policy topics and at developing best-practice analytical tools to support the operationalisation of these policies. It also manages the SRB's cooperation with the European Systemic Risk Board. Moreover, experts from the Unit are included in all crisis cases for the topic of the PIA,

In your role as Data Science Expert, you will contribute to the data-driven analytical work within the SRB. In particular, your focus with be on the quantitative analysis related to the impact of a bank's failure on financial stability, developing and applying quantitative models based on statistical, supervisory and resolution data, to be used in resolution planning as well as in crisis cases. When needed, you will be involved in resolution schemes and crisis management situations, with a focus on economic and financial aspects. You will cooperate with other members of the unit and/or of SRB to complete other assigned tasks, such as the development of resolution policies, analytical methodologies and data collections applicable to and necessary for the consistent and efficient carrying out of the duties of the Unit.

1.1 Tasks

In particular, you will be asked to perform the following tasks:

Economics

- Development and implementation of models for financial stability, risk monitoring and resolution planning analysis;
- Development of reproducible data pipelines to feed quantitative modelling, combining a large number of registries with relational database systems;
- Conduct financial econometric analyses of banking and financial market data;
- Conduct targeted ad-hoc quantitative analysis, presentations and briefings on financial stability risks relevant to European financial markets;
- Provide research-based policy advice to the SRB decision-making bodies.

Applied computer science

- Carry out quantitative analysis implied by the Public Interest Assessment, in particular related to critical functions and financial stability analysis;
- Contribute to the developing of econometric tools, models and the necessary infrastructure to support the analysis of financial stability implications of a bank's failure on its direct and indirect counterparties or related financial market infrastructures;
- Contribute to the application of data science techniques, including automated machine learning pipelines and interactive data visualizations;
- Contribute with quantitative analysis on subjects of financial stability and financial continuity in resolution and other topics that fall within the responsibility of the unit.

Carry out any other tasks requested by line management in the interest of the service.



Qualifications and Other requirements

2. Eligibility criteria

Only complete applications registered via EU CV ONLINE and before the deadline for applications as mentioned in this document will be considered. Applications must include a motivation letter and a CV, both submitted in English to be considered; applications received in other languages than English will not be considered eligible.

2.1 General conditions

By the closing date of this call, candidates must:

- be nationals of a Member State of the European Union;
- enjoy their full rights as citizens1;
- · have fulfilled any obligations imposed by national laws concerning military service;
- meet the character requirements for the duties involved;
- be physically fit to perform their duties².

2.2 Education

A level of education which corresponds to completed university studies of at least three years attested by a diploma.

Candidates must indicate in their applications the official graduation dates for all the diplomas they have obtained.

Only study titles that have been awarded in EU Member States or that are subject to the equivalence certificates issued by the authorities in the said Member States shall be taken into consideration. In case of qualifications issued by authorities outside EU Member States, the proof of recognition of equivalence by the relevant EU Member State authorities must be specifically mentioned in the online application form under `*Additional information*'.

2.3 Language skills

As the predominant working language of the SRB is English, candidates must have an excellent command of spoken and written English (note: native English speakers will be required to demonstrate the ability to work in a second EU language at interview stage). Candidates must also have a satisfactory knowledge of another official language of the European Union³ to the extent necessary for the performance of his/her duties.

3. Selection criteria

Essential

3.1 Specific criteria

- Suitability to perform the tasks described in Section 1.1;
- A university degree in economics, finance, mathematics, physics, engineering, statistics or data science or another relevant field;
- Proven expertise in using quantitative, statistical and econometric techniques;
- · Proven expertise in using data science techniques.

¹ Prior to the appointment, the successful candidate will be asked to provide a certificate of good conduct, confirming the absence of any criminal record.

² Before taking up his/her duties, the successful candidate will undergo a medical examination by one of the institutions' medical officers.

3.2 General competences

- · Excellent analytical and problem-solving skills and ability to think creatively;
- · Ability to communicate complex issues in a clear manner;
- Strong programming skills in statistical computing languages (as, e.g. R, Python, Matlab, Stata, C++);
- · Customer-oriented attitude and team-working spirit;
- · Ability to collaborate across and within teams.

Advantageous

- A PhD and/or relevant publications in economics, finance, statistics, data science or similar dealing with quantitative analysis related to financial markets or applicable to financial data;
- Experience either in the financial industry or in a central bank, national macroprudential, supervisory or resolution authority or relevant international organisations;
- Experience with the use of supervisory and prudential data as well as data related to the analysis of the macroeconomic developments of Banking Union countries;
- · Experience in using modern technologies for robust, reproducible data science work;
- · Experience of working in multicultural organisations.

The selection process

4. How to apply

Candidates must apply through the EU CV Online system⁴ via this link:

Before applying, candidates should carefully check whether they meet all the eligibility criteria.

To be able to apply online via the EU CV online database, candidates must first create an account or sign in to an existing account. If not done already, candidates must first fill in the electronic CV, write the motivation letter and apply to the call for expressions of interest.

Applications shall be made in English to be considered.

It is the sole responsibility of each applicant to complete <u>ALL relevant fields</u> of his/her online application and to submit it before the deadline for submission. All technical questions concerning EU CV online must be sent through the Contact page of EU CV online.

It is strongly advised not to wait until the last few days before the deadline for applying, since heavy internet traffic or connection difficulties could lead to problems.

Once the deadline has passed, candidates will no longer be able to register.

Deadline for applications: 10/01/2022 at midday (12:00 Brussels time).

No supporting documents are required at this stage – these will be required at a later stage.

On completion of the online registration, candidates will receive on screen a registration number, which they must note. This will be the reference number of the candidate in all matters concerning his/her application. If the candidate does not receive a number, the application has not been registered.

After a correct submission of an application, candidates will receive an automated acknowledgement of receipt of their application to the email account indicated in their application. It is the candidate's responsibility to verify that he/she provided the correct e-mail address.

Candidates are invited to indicate any special arrangements that may be required if invited to attend the assessment.

5. Steps of the selection procedure

5.1 Admission to the selection procedure

After the deadline for online registration, the Selection Panel will verify the submitted applications against the eligibility criteria described in Section 2 "**Eligibility criteria**". Applications satisfying these conditions will then be assessed against the "**Selection criteria**" under Section 3.

5.2 Assessment of the eligible applications

The Selection Panel will analyse the motivation letters and CVs of eligible applicants with reference to:

- The Selection Criteria ("Essential" and "Advantageous")
- The overall assessment of the quality & suitability of the application based on the requirements of the post.

Upon completion of the assessment, the Selection Panel will establish a shortlist of candidates, best matching the needs of the Agency for the functions and duties mentioned in this vacancy notice and non-retained candidates will be notified of the status of their application.

5.3 Invitation to assessment phase

Following the evaluation of the applications, the most suitable candidates for the post will be invited to an assessment, which will be held in Brussels or remotely.

Details of the time, date and address of the assessment will be communicated to candidates in due time.

5.4 The assessment phase

An interview and a written test, and/or other tests with the Selection Panel will enable it to carry out an assessment of the candidate according to the "Selection criteria" described in Section 3.

The assessment phase will be conducted in English.

5.5 Verification of documents and scrutiny

The candidates' applications will be checked against supporting documents provided in order to confirm the accuracy and eligibility of the application.

The candidate will be disqualified from the selection process if at any stage of the procedure it is established that the information provided in the application has been knowingly falsified or incorrect.

You will also be disqualified if you:

- do not meet all the eligibility criteria;
- · do not provide all the required supporting documents.



5.6 Reserve list

The Selection Panel will place the most suitable eligible candidates on a draft reserve list. This draft will be submitted to the Chair of the SRB for approval. The adopted reserve list will be valid until 31/12/2022. The validity of the reserve list may be extended by decision of the Chair of the Board.

Candidates should note that inclusion on a reserve list does not imply any entitlement to employment in the SRB.

Prior to being offered a post, candidates on a reserve list may be required to undergo further evaluation by the SRB (e.g. including a further interview).

Other important information

6. General information

6.1 Equal opportunities

The SRB applies a policy of equal opportunities and accepts applications without discrimination on the ground of sex, race, colour, ethnic or social origin, genetic features, language, religion or belief, political or any other opinion, membership of a national minority, property, birth, disability, age or sexual orientation.

6.2 Selection Panel

A Selection Panel will be appointed for this selection procedure and will be composed of at least 3 members (and alternates), including a member designated by the Staff Committee of the SRB.

The names of the Selection Panel members will be communicated to the shortlisted candidates in the invitation letter to their assessment.

Under no circumstances should candidates approach the Selection Panel, either directly or indirectly, concerning the selection procedure. The Selection Panel's internal proceedings are strictly confidential and any contact with its members is strictly forbidden. The Chair of the SRB reserves the right to disqualify any candidate who disregards these instructions.

6.3 Approximate timetable

The selection process may take some months to be completed; no information will be released during this period.

6.4 Appointment and conditions of employment

On the basis of the reserve list, successful candidates may be offered a contract as a Temporary Agent, AD5, in accordance with the SRB's Implementing Provisions on the employment of Temporary staff under Article 2f of the Conditions of employment of other servants of the European Union for an initial period of 3 years (including a probationary period of **nine** months).

The contract may be renewed for a further period of three years. After the second period, the contract may be renewed for an indefinite period.

The place of employment is Brussels (Belgium), where the SRB has its premises.

Temporary Agents will be required to demonstrate before their first promotion the ability to work in a third official language of the EU.

6.5 Remuneration

Successful candidates who are offered a contract of employment will, on entry into service, be placed in step 1 or step 2 of the relevant grade, according to the length of their professional experience. The basic monthly salaries for grade AD5, as at 1 July 2021 in Brussels, are:



- Step 1: € 5 010.72
- Step 2: € 5 221.27

In addition to the basic salary, staff members may be entitled to various allowances depending on their personal situation, such as expatriation allowance, household allowance, dependent child allowance, education allowance, etc. The salary is subject to a Community tax deducted at source and staff members are exempt of national taxation.

6.6 Protection of personal data

The purpose of processing the data submitted by candidates is to evaluate applications in view of possible recruitment at the SRB. The personal information requested by the SRB from candidates will be processed as required by Regulation (EU) 2018/1725 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 23 October 2018 on the protection of natural persons with regard to the processing of personal data by the Union institutions, bodies, offices and agencies and on the free movement of such data (Official Journal of the European Union, L 295 of 21 November 2018). This applies in particular to the confidentiality and security of such data. In this regard, please see the <u>Privacy statement</u>.

6.7 Appeal procedure

Pursuant to Article 90(2) of the Staff Regulations of Officials of the European Union, any candidate may submit to the SRB a complaint against an act adversely affecting him/her. Any such complaint should be made to:

The complaint must be lodged within 3 months from the date on which the candidate is notified of the act adversely affecting him/her.

Should the complaint be rejected, the candidate may request judicial review of the act adversely affecting him/her pursuant to Article 270 of the Treaty on the Functioning of the European Union and Article 91 of the Staff Regulations, before:
